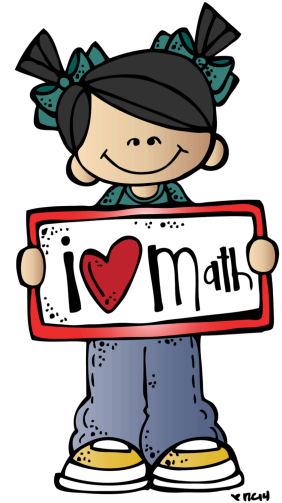


Dear Soon to be Third Graders,

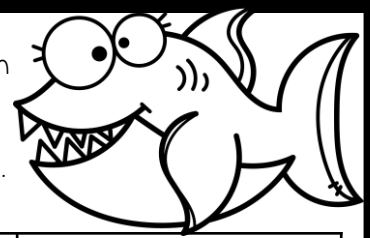

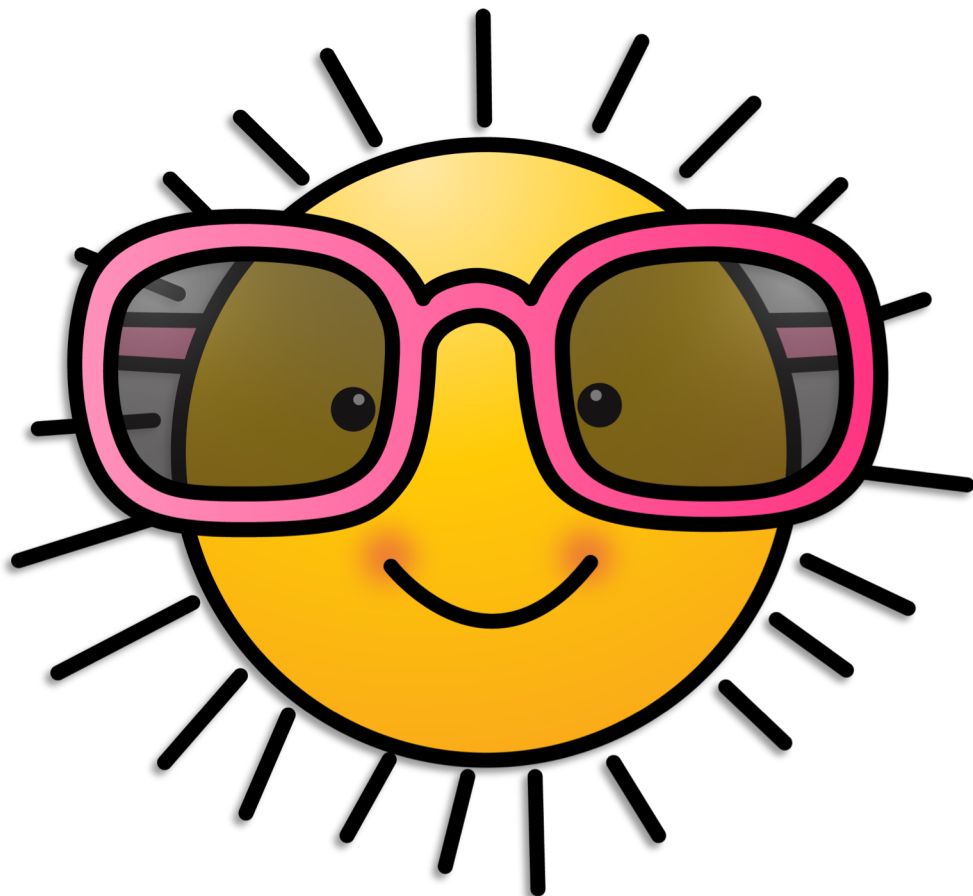

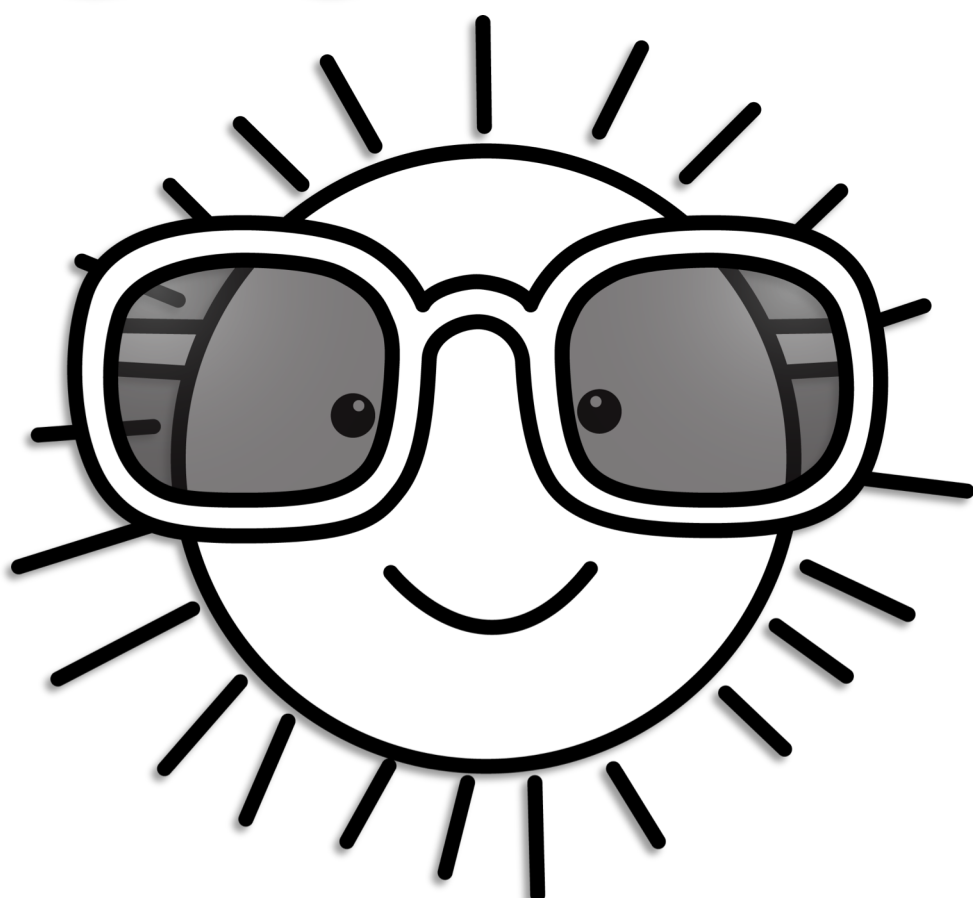
